Action Agenda: Immunity Recommendations	<p>Reviewed the Immunity memo sent to the legislature in the fall and the recommendation options laid out in the memo.</p> <p>The group reached consensus that consistency in immunity policy is needed. Discussed the idea of drafting model policy language for institutions and whether or not that should be introduced legislatively. Vote taken via poll to move forward with drafting a model policy and introduce legislation.</p> <p>A sub-committee will work on developing the language and bring them back to the group. Action Agenda: Discuss Annual Review of Aggregate Campus Data	<p>Formally universities and colleges all report through Cleary but this doesn't paint the full picture of what is happening on campuses. There is no uniform or consistent way of collecting this information but there are other ways that institutions collect this data- it just isn't uniform.</p> <p>A need to understand the scope of the issue in the state- The question is what do we know about the issues of sexual harm at</p>		

	<p>campuses at in VT and what informs this? Identifying the quantitative sources that exist already and whether or not we need a way to gather this aggregate data.</p> <p>Once a sense of scope is developed, what does this qualitatively look like for students on campus? More information needs to be gathered directly from students about their perceptions and needs. Maybe some institutions are doing this already and perhaps more information and outreach is needed.</p> <p>If there was a mechanism to gather this information qualitatively and quantitatively, what might this look like? This council can envision this and ask for statewide resources to put it into effect.</p> <p>Question here around do we want to know just what is happening on our campuses or our entire student lived experiences and what is happening to them in the full scope outside of the institution. Students bring their full lived experiences onto campus so it is part of their campus experience.</p>		
<p>Action Agenda: Discuss Topics for Future Meetings</p>	<p>Plan to send a survey out to narrow down topics for future discussion:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Prevention best practices and standards - Statewide database of prevention programs - Restorative justice on campuses for sexual harm - Supporting those who are causing harm and their learning and growth- community and campus coordination to interrupt behaviors - Student activism - Prevention, Title IX advocacy and intervention works together as a group - Consent culture and how it is endorsed, supported on campuses 		

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Demographic accountability- how do we give data in a way that doesn't put institutions on the defensive but lets us know if some groups/identities are consistently coming up as the victims/ those who are causing harm - Anonymous reporting - Title IX process and how students can access it clearly, not so terrifying - Counseling services and supports for victims are lacking and hard to get for students- how do we make these more accessible? - There is a lack of clarity especially from an outside advocate around who to refer students for support, accountability, etc
